What's Happening for the month of September



This week we are introducing the last two spirit animals who came forward to help, telling their story.



Beaver:

Beaver is another animal that volunteers to help build Turtle Island.

The beaver teaches us wisdom.

Muskrat:

Small and oftentimes overlooked, the muskrat is the last animal to volunteer to gather the much needed soil to build Turtle Island.
