WHAT ARE THE COLOURS?

The four areas of the medicine wheel have many different attributes assigned to them. Four sacred **colours: red, yellow black and white,** four **directions**, four sacred **medicines**, four **seasons**, four **elements**, four **stages of life**. Some teachings include the four **nations** of the people of the world and four **sacred animals.** Different tribes and nations have different medicine wheel teachings based on their own **stories**, **values**, and **beliefs** and one is not more correct than another. The Medicine Wheel strives to bring together balance, equality and diversity.

The United Church of Canada has adopted the four colours.




Stories of Our Mission
