# From the Oversight Council

#### Replacement of Flooring in the Rainbow Room

It has come to the attention of the Oversight Council that some congregants were surprised when the flooring was replaced in the lower level of our building. The Council was remiss in not informing the Community of Faith of the reasons for this decision before the work was undertaken. I will endeavor to correct that omission now.

The Property Team has been concerned about the condition of the flooring in the Rainbow Room and other areas in the lower level for several years. Recently the floor has become a serious hazard that could cause a slip and fall injury. The Rainbow Room is one of Prairie Spirit's most valuable spaces both for our own use and for rentals. It is in constant use seven days a week by people of all ages and abilities. The safety of those using this space is of utmost importance therefore replacing the floor had definitely become a priority.

The Property Team gathered quotes and brought a motion to the May 29, 2023 Oversight Council meeting. Council members agreed that the flooring needed to be replaced and discussed the timing of the work. With PSUC closed in August there was a window to have the work done this year or it would have to wait until the summer of 2024. The Council agreed that with new renters coming in the fall, the work could not wait a year. The motion to replace the flooring passed unanimously.

It was unfortunate that this expenditure was not part of the budget presented to the Community of Faith on April 2, 2023. Although replacing the flooring was a substantial expenditure, we have the financial ability to maintain the safety and security of our building. The work needed to be done and the Oversight Council has the duty to approve capital expenditures for any project or asset not previously specified by the Community of Faith. Be assured that the Oversight Council will always act in a way that is prudent and protects the people who use Prairie Spirit for worship, fellowship, meetings and other gatherings.

On June 22, at our  $25^{th}$  Anniversary celebration, we were finally able to have an assembly in Holy Cross School's gym and present our  $53^{rd}$  and  $54^{th}$  wheelchairs to Bernard & Hayden, and what a special day it was! We also had the opportunity and pleasure to meet Kyrie, who will be our 2024 recipient. For those who didn't get to watch CTV's coverage of the event, you will be able to at the end of this letter.

Thank you to everyone for helping us achieve this milestone! Your participation and dedication to this program is the reason we have accomplished this wonderful goal! You can be very proud of what we have been able to do in these last 25 years! A special thanks goes out to those who take the time to drop off their tabs, cans and metals of all kinds to Western Scrap Metals in Winnipeg or Wesman Salvage in Brandon. This definitely adds greatly to our total! Please remember to always inform them that it is for "Tabs for Wheelchairs".

Our program has been blessed once again by our generous donor of the last five years. This family is wanting to give six specialized wheelchairs, in memory of my son, Anthony, as it was the sixth anniversary of his passing in June. Thank you so much, and I know Anthony would have been very pleased to be remembered with anything to do with those precious little tabs!

A few weeks ago, Western Scrap Metals presented me with a cheque for \$6758.60, plus a \$100 donation. Over the last year, 10,237 lbs. of aluminum tabs and 857 lbs. of miscellaneous metals were brought to their place. This is a little less than the previous year because this year the collection of tabs was for only 9 months while the year before was for 12. Wesman Salvage in Brandon has also given us a cheque for \$1614.44. It is so nice to have another location in our province to receive tabs and metals of all kinds and keep a running tab for our program! A big thank you to both of these companies for all that they do for us!

Trailblazers Life Choices must also be mentioned and recognized as they have been a tremendous asset to the program by bagging all the tabs delivered to them, both in Winnipeg and Steinbach. Important to note: both locations will be closed for the Christmas holidays from Friday, Dec. 22 - Monday, Jan. 8.
