Sunday March 31st - Easter Sunday - will be led by Retired Lay Worship Leader, Rita Swan.


National Affirming Day / PIE Day:



If you have large, heavy items too large for your vehicle, arrangements can be made for a pick-up. No charge.



Two Years of War in Ukraine

Russia's invasion of Ukraine on February 24, 2022, sparked a humanitarian crisis and has left more than 30,000 people dead. As of January 2024, more than 3.6 million people are displaced within the country and about 6.3 million others have sought refuge abroad.
